*Erin's Lament* was played by third class passenger Eugene Daly on his Uilleann pipes as *Titanic* departed Cobh, Ireland.

*Nearer My God to Thee* is believed by many to have been the final music played by *Titanic's* heroic bandsmen. There are at least six settings to the hymn; the tune heard today, "Propior Deo," was a favorite of bandmaster Wallace Hartley and was written by Sir Arthur Sullivan of Gilbert and Sullivan fame.

*Amazing Grace* is among the most popular of all American hymns, though its words and tune were written by Britons. Dating from the time of the American Revolution, it was sung during the Civil War and the Civil Rights movement. It was selected for today's ceremony to reflect Catherine Buckley's American destination.

The Recessional and Postlude honor Catherine Buckley's Irish homeland.
